

# OATS



## CDC ORRIN



A top yielding variety of covered oat that shows an outstanding performance in our region.

This variety was selected based on its agronomic performance and its disease reaction.

In trials conducted in the Maritimes, CDC Orrin out yielded every oat variety tested, reaching production of 4.77 t/ha. This variety produces grain with very high test weight and very good kernel weight.

CDC Orrin produces excellent grain quality with very good milling potential. This variety shows very good lodging resistance, the crop reaches maturity approximately 98 days after planting.

This variety produces plants that are approximately 102 cm tall with good resistance to Septoria and Fusarium Head blight. Its seeds are white with 25.2% Hull.

Seeding rate:      straight seeded - 150-160 kg/ha  
                              underseeded to forage - 90 kg/ha

## TRIPLE CROWN (Co-op Exclusive)



A high yielding variety of oats that produces very good straw.

Triple Crown is a white type of oats that is ideal for horse feeding programs.

Because of its wide leaves and high dry matter content Triple Crown is also ideal in grain mixes for silage production.

In Trials conducted in the Maritimes, Triple Crown shows an outstanding performance in the multiyear test, where it has been ranked as one of the top yielding varieties.

This variety has good lodging resistance, low hull percentage and good resistance to crown rust.

Triple Crown is a medium maturity (approx. 104 days after planting) variety that is well adapted to most types of soil. Its consistent high yields and its good drought tolerance make this variety an ideal crop for farmers in the maritime region.

Triple Crown Oats is a Co-op exclusive variety that has been tested and highly recommended across Eastern Canada.

Seeding rate:      straight seeded - 150-160 kg/ha  
                              underseeded to forage - 90 kg/ha



 **NOVA**



An early maturing (approx. 102 days after planting) oat that has very good yield and low percent of hull. In the Eastern Co-operative Oat tests, Nova was the highest yielder, outperforming Shaw, Marion and other leading varieties. Nova also has stronger lodging resistance and higher test weight than other varieties. This variety is well adapted throughout the Maritimes. Its kernels are large and plumped. Nova shows moderate resistance to red leaf and septoria leaf blotch.

Seeding rate:     straight seeded - 150-160 kg/ha  
                          underseeded to forage - 90 kg/ha
